The board of directors, staff, and volunteers of Hospice of Stanly remain steadfastly committed to the patients and families we serve. We remain committed to the communities we serve. The personcentered care we deliver enables our patients and families who are living with a serious or life-limiting illness to be surrounded with compassion and support that promotes dignity, courage, and peace.

That commitment to community fuels our desire for growth – our hospice program's average daily census increased by 35% in 2022. Additionally, our agency launched a palliative care program, further demonstrating our unwavering commitment to living and fulfilling our mission. The growth in our capacity allows more in our community to benefit from compassionate care services.

And the care we deliver is of the highest quality. Hospice of Stanly achieved a triple play in quality metrics:

- 1. We achieved a 5-star rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), one of only 9 hospices in the state of North Carolina to earn this distinction.
- 2. We were awarded the recognition of a Hospice Honors Elite, exceeding the National Performance Score on every evaluated question for the 8th consecutive year.
- 3. Hospice of Stanly received a 10 out of 10 on the Hospice Care Index (CMS) outperforming the North Carolina average score of 9.4 and the national average of 8.8.



# Palliative Care

Thank you to the Stanly Community Foundation for their support in the launch of the palliative care program. Hospice of Stanly launched the palliative care program in February 2022, serving 120 patients by year's end. Palliative care is provided by a team of specialists, including a physician, nurse practitioner, nurses, and social workers who work together with a patient's other doctors to provide an extra layer of support. It can be provided along with curative, aggressive treatment.


#### Palliative vs. Hospice...What's the Difference?


#### What is Palliative Care?

Palliative care aims to improve quality of life and the distressing symptoms caused by serious illness.

#### What is Hospice Care?

Hospice care provides aggressive symptom management in patients with a terminal illness; life expectancy is 6 months or less and treatment is no longer being pursued.

# Bereavement

694 Clients Served in 2022 Hospice of Stanly, in partnership with the City of Albemarle, hosted Light the Lake: A Water Lantern Celebration held at the October 7th Food Truck Friday at City Lake Park. Nearly 450 lanterns were distributed to the crowd to be lit and launched onto City Lake.

The bereavement team provides counseling support to our patient's families and any person who is coping with grief after a death related loss. All our counseling services are provided at no charge. This robust grief program includes one-on-one support, small support groups, Camp Forget-Me-Not, a summer grief series, and Light the Lake: A Water Lantern Celebration.



The bereavement team offers an annual free grief camp for children and their families who have experienced a loss. Held in partnership with Camp Joshua in Albemarle, Camp Forget-Me-Not is open to any grieving child in the community ages 5-18 along with their families. The special day includes a butterfly release as well as a host of other activities for children and their families.
